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
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Other information

Home learning

Weekly Home Learning (Compulsory)

<u>Reading</u>: As always, we will be encouraging the children to **read** as often as possible. Please remember to sign your child's reading card (maximum once per day) in order for them to receive dojo rewards and for the chance to win books in our prize draws.

<u>Spelling</u>: To help them learn their weekly spellings, the children are expected to complete some activities on the Spelling Shed website each week. There will be a spelling test each Friday and certificates to be earned!

<u>Maths</u>: We will be continuing to have a focus on times tables to make sure that all children are able to recall the times tables up to 12 x 12 as well as the corresponding division facts. Each week, the children are expected to practise at home using '*Times Tables Rock Stars*' for at least 10 minutesthis is especially important for the Year 4's who will be completing their times table check this year. Mr Horton has recently signed our school up to Maths.co.uk. Your child will be set a homework task each week to complete, each task will link to our current learning in class.

Creative Homework (Optional)

- Design a new peace symbol.
- Research the history behind the Nobel Peace Prize and make a presentation to tell its story.
- Create a survey and ask people to vote. Produce a report about the results of your survey.
- Create an illustrated acrostic using the word DEMOCRACY.
