

To encourage a love of reading and support our work in English, we are continuing to study at least one key book per term.

The book for this term will be the enchanting story of 'Stick Man', written by Julia Donaldson.

Home learning

Weekly Home Learning (Compulsory)

Reading: As always, we will be encouraging the children to read as often as possible. Please remember to sign your child's reading card (maximum once per day) for them to receive dojo rewards and for the chance to win books in our prize draws.

Spelling: To help them learn their weekly spellings, the children will come home with a spelling list or a phonics activity book to practise their skills. There will be a spelling test each Friday to assess the children's progression. **Maths:** Each week, the children are expected to practise their mathematics skills at home via the 'Numbots' site. All children have been sent home with their log-in details and instructions to access the site. Dojos are awarded to the children who complete their 'Numbots' tasks each week!

<u>Creative Homework (Optional)</u>

- Create your own Arctic word search.
- Write a poem about snow and ice.
- A new animal has been discovered at the North Pole. Can you name, describe and draw it?
- Imagine you are staying with a traditional Inuit family. Write a letter home telling them all about it.
- Make your own ice-lollies. Try and invent a new -flavour.
