Home Learning

Weekly Home Learning (Compulsory)

<u>Reading</u>: As always, we will be encouraging the children to **read** as often as possible. Please remember to sign your child's reading card (maximum once per day).

<u>Spelling</u>: To help them learn their weekly spellings, the children are expected to complete some activities on the Spelling Shed website each week. There will be a spelling test each Friday.

<u>Maths</u>: We will be continuing to have a focus on **times tables** to make sure that all children are able to recall the times tables up to 12×12 (Year 4) 2,3,4,5,8,10 $\times 12$ (Year 3) as well as the corresponding division facts. Each week, the children are expected to practise at home using '*Times Tables Rock Stars*'. There will be dojos for the children who go above and beyond the homework set for them.

Creative Home Learning (Optional) Here are some choices of creative homework projects. If you choose to do one or more of them, they can be brought to school at any time during the 6week topic.

Research the links between modern day commerce and Ancient Greece e.g., Argos, Nike.

- Produce a tourist information leaflet about Greece (Ancient and Modern) listing places of interest.
- Learn some Greek words.
- Look at different shapes in Greek architecture.
- Make Greek masks linked to myths.
