Space Week - Wednesday 4th to Tuesday 10th October 2023

The theme of World Space Week 2023 is 'Space and Entrepreneurship.' This theme aims to start a conversation and raise awareness about the growing commercial space industry and the impact that it will have on space science and its advancements. During Space Week, we are going to be doing lots of work on this and complete lots of other interesting activities and investigations.

Home Learning

Weekly Home Learning (compulsory)

<u>Reading</u>: As always, we will be encouraging the children to **read** as often as possible. Please remember to sign your child's reading card (maximum once per day) in order for them to receive dojo rewards and for the chance to win books in our prize draws.

Spelling: To help them learn their weekly spellings, the children are expected to complete some activities on the Spelling Shed website each week. All children have brought home their log-in details. There will be a spelling test each Friday. **Maths**: We will be continuing to have a focus on times tables to make sure that all children are able to recall the times tables up to 12 x 12 as well as the corresponding division facts. Each week, the children are expected to practise at home using *'Times Tables Rock Stars'* for at least 30 minutes. All children have brought home their log-in details. There will be dojos for the children who go above and beyond the homework set for them.

Creative Homework (optional) Here are some choices of creative homework projects. If you choose to do one or more of them, they can be brought to school at any time during the six-week topic.

- Write a poem about one of the planets.
- You are going to meet some aliens visiting from Planet Zorbitron. What 10 things would you give them to take back as gifts? Draw them in a gift box. Explain why you have chosen the items.
- Bake some space-themed biscuits.
- Create a new mnemonic that will help others in the class remember the names of the planets and their order from the sun.
