#### **Theme Overview**

"Unity in the Community" is a thematic unit about the area you live in, with a geography focus. Pupils will develop their geographical skills, local knowledge and understanding through learning about their school, the features of its grounds, the surrounding area and how it has changed over time. They will be taught all about the importance of acting responsibly within both the school and the wider community.


### Art

#### **Home learning**

#### Weekly Home Learning (Compulsory)

**<u>Reading</u>**: As always, we will be encouraging the children to read as often as possible. Please remember to sign your child's reading card (maximum once per day) for them to receive dojo rewards (10 to be exact!) and for the chance to win books in our prize draws.

**Spelling:** To help them learn their weekly spellings, the children will come home with a spelling list or a phonics activity to practise their skills. There will be a spelling test each Friday to assess the children's progression. **Maths:** Each week, the children will be sent home with a maths activity sheet to complete. Also, they are able to practise their skills further via the 'Numbots' site. All children have been sent home with their log-in details and instructions to access the site (please let me know if you require a replacement copy). 2 Dojos are awarded to the children who complete their homework tasks each week!

#### <u>Creative Homework (Optional)</u>

- Create your own street using any materials you can find.
- Draw, paint or model familiar buildings in your locality.
- Make a leaflet about safe places to play and/or crossing the road safely in your locality.
- Role-play jobs held within the local community. How do they help and why?
- Use foil trays to create different environments and habitats i.e. rural, seaside and urban.
- Design a questionnaire to ask local people's opinions about aspects of the local area.
