#### Council Cameras

Please be aware that cameras have been installed outside the school drive

to monitor the 'School Keep Clear' Markings. The innovative camera technology is designed to promote a safer environment around school gates by reducing congestion, which, in turn improves air quality.

The cameras will be operated during school times and will only be used for enforcement purposes on the keep clear restriction. Residential properties will be obscured with a privacy filter, and only trained Civil Enforcement

Officers will review the footage to action.
